

CLEAN

Your Jewell Hardwoods Custom Table has been spray finished with multiple coats of “RUDD 2-Part Conversion Varnish”. We transitioned to this finish in 2014 in order to provide a harder and more durable finish.

General Care & Cleaning:

- Immediately wipe all spills and standing water, then dry thoroughly. Left unattended a spill can penetrate through a coated surface and cause staining or damage.
- Coated surfaces may be cleaned periodically with a clean damp sponge or soft cloth. For more difficult greasy surfaces, a mild detergent solution can be prepared using any common dishwashing liquid or specially formulated cleaner designed for fine furniture and cabinetry.
- Wipe all surfaces dry after cleaning. Avoid using soiled dishcloths or sponges, high pH cleaners (ammonia), and cleaners containing bleach or abrasives.



PREVENT

Preventative Care:

- Excess water or moisture can result in many different forms of damage to a coated wood surface ranging from blushing or hazing to black stains. Wipe up all spills immediately, particularly around sinks, dishwashers, and in the bathroom. Avoid leaving damp cloths or sponges in direct contact with coated surfaces.
- Care should be taken in locating coffee makers, rice cookers and toaster ovens to avoid venting steam directly onto nearby cabinetry.
- Sunlight can cause discoloration as lightening or darkening over time.
- When possible, keep coated wood surfaces out of direct sunlight or close blinds during sunny times.
- Extremes in temperature will cause wood to expand and contract and eventually damage the finish. Avoid exposing coated surfaces to very hot and cold conditions such as self cleaning ovens, near radiators, heating or air conditioning vents, or in garages.
- Use hot pads, coasters, and placemats on table tops to avoid heat, cold, and moisture.
- Harsh chemicals and abrasives such as ammonia (strongly alkaline), bleach, abrasive pads, steel wool, and cleaners or polishes containing abrasives will mar, dull or deteriorate a coated surface.

MAINTAIN

Maintaining your table:

- Polishing may be done with a high quality furniture polish. Use a light coat following the manufacturer's application recommendations. Select a polish that contains no silicone, heavy wax, or oil. These types of polishes will leave a residue that will attract dust and be difficult to remove later. Be sure to test any cleaner or polish prior to use in an obscure area.
